

## The AFM – Award

You've already worked it ...

... or didn't you ???



But it is really not difficult:

Licensed radio amateurs and SWLs need

as DL-Stationen	15 points
as EU-Stationen	10 points
as DX-Station	5 points .

Any QSO with a member of Förderverein Amateurfunkmuseum counts one point per band. QSOs with club stations of Förderverein Amateurfunkmuseum or the collaborating amateur radio museums are counting five points (only once!). QSOs with those local groups of the DARC who are member of Förderverein Amateurfunkmuseum are counting three points (only once!).

For equipment that has been donated to the Förderverein Amateurfunkmuseum a score of between 1 and five points can be granted. The number of points granted will be determined by a jury.

All QSOs having taken place after November 21<sup>st</sup>, 1981 (which is the foundation day of Förderverein Amateurfunkmuseum) are valid for this award.

This award has been acknowledged by the club meeting of DARC in October 1985.

A list of members and club stations counting for this award can be requested at the award manager provided the request is accompanied by SAL and one IRC or downloaded from our homepage [www.amateurfunkmuseum.de](http://www.amateurfunkmuseum.de) .

Your award manager is looking forward to receive your award application plus GCR list plus the amount of EUR 10.00. When sending cheques or transferring money please make sure that the full amount is payable in Germany without any transfer fees. The amount includes packing and shipping which is fair enough from our point of view – so please help us to avoid additional costs.

... operates working groups in whole Germany and is with around 400 members quite active on both national and international levels

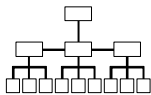
### ... asks all radio amateurs and friends :

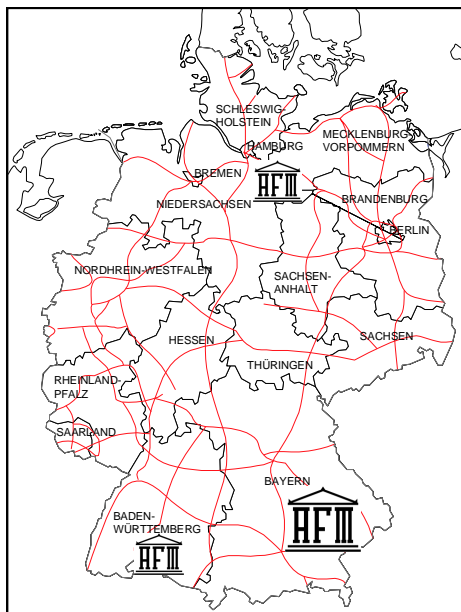

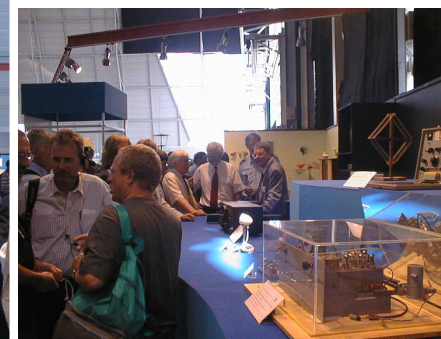
